
Food Pantry

- Holy Communion is open to all who are baptized and trust that Christ is present in the meal, regardless of your tradition or affiliation. Pastors are available to talk about Holy Baptism if you desire to join in the Lord's Supper.
- We share communion by intinction. Proceed to one of the stations via the center aisle. A communion server will give you bread to dip in the red wine or grape juice found in the chalice. Please return to your seat via the side aisles.
- Gluten-free bread is available at the table in the front center aisle. Remove a wafer from the bowl and pick up a cup of wine or juice, then step forward to hear the words, "given for you."
- Children who do not yet receive communion or those who are not baptized are encouraged to come forward for a blessing. Cross your arms in front of you to signal your desire for a blessing.
- Restrooms are located on the north (women's) and south (men's) sides of the Narthex (lobby).
- A Family/All-Gender Restroom is available on the north side of the Narthex.
- Children are invited and encouraged to worship with you. A supervised nursery is available on Wednesdays and Sundays for children 4 years and younger if you choose this option for all or part of the service.
- Children's Bulletins are available from the ushers. Busy Bags are hanging in the Narthex near the Welcome Center.
- Hospitalized? Please inform the staff if you are going to be or unexpectedly admitted to the hospital.
