Programs

Holy Trinity is very open to experimentation in programming. While there are long-established activities and organizations, they are starting places from which creativity is embraced. Our programs are inclusive and a priority is making sure everyone knows they are loved. Some of the programs most connected to the work of the Pastor for Care & Community are:

- A growing small group ministry which offers support groups including grief, divorce recovery groups
- Fellowship groups that meet to build friendship
- Study groups including book studies and biblical study
- Serving groups that work with mission partners and serve in the congregation
- Ministries of care including Stephen Ministers, eucharistic ministers, congregational care of the homebound

- Inviting ministries that include integration of new members, baptismal preparation, marriage, and wedding ministry
- Teaching ministries including book studies, work with confirmation students, adult learning opportunities

The congregation also has a wide variety of programs that include:

- Music groups for all ages and level of gifts
- Active lay ministry in worship
- Mission partnerships with Mosaic, LSI, ELCA World Hunger Appeal, Habitat for Humanity, the Freestore, Hope Ministries and our own food pantry

The congregation has active ministries with the children and youth of the congregation that include learning, service, and faith milestone ministries.

COMMENTARY

The Pastor for Care and Community works as a member of a team which includes the Lead Pastor, Minister for Learning, Minister for Worship & Music, and the staff. The staff is organized into ministry teams for Worship, Care & Community, Outreach, Stewardship, and Learning. Work is collaborative and leads to the formation of teams of members engaged in the mission of the church through its various programs.

Holy Trinity is:

- A congregation that honors the ancient traditions of the church while it presents them in ever new ways, to an ever-changing community.
- A congregation where people can find not just the latest spiritual fads but find a path to spiritual growth and maturity that touches their broken places, offers meaning and hope for every day, and roots people in a faith that is both ancient and future.
